## **MEETING NOTES**

- 1. Introduction & Welcome
- 2. Review of Minutes from 2011 RBC Specialty Conference- Mike Moore/Bob Gillette
  - Kudos from Bob Reimers and the entire RBC Specialty Conference Committee on the exceptional job done by Mike Moore and Bob Gillette on the Sacramento conference.
- 2012 RBC Specialty Conference Update- Raleigh, NC Richard Tsang March 25-28, 2012
  - Conference is organizing well. Opening General Session is still a work-in-process and Richard is awaiting a few confirmations along with the amount of money that is available for OGS speakers;
  - Social Event "Southern style Pig Picking". There will also be a band and the event will be within walking distance of the conference center.
  - Golf Tournament there will be a golf tournament on Saturday prior to the conference to benefit "Water for People". Registration will be handled by WEF staff.
  - Tour Raleigh Neuse River Plant (aerobic digestion, belt press and centrifuge dewatering, conveyance system (fairly complex screws, horizontal and vertical, with storage hoppers for truck loading, Class A alkaline treatment, and then to Cary South Plant, rotary drum dryer.

- Workshops All to be held on Sunday: Two (2) Full-Day and one (1) Half-Day workshops;
- There was discussion on the National Biosolids Partnership (NBP) having a 1 to 2 day meeting at the beginning or end of the Raleigh conference. NBP is leaning more towards back-end of conference. NBP meeting will be for Southeast Region participants. The intention is to not interfere with the RBC meeting and / or limit participants ability to attend either event. The intent of this meeting is a follow-up to the meeting that was held earlier in 2011 the provided insight into the critical issues of Biosolids programs are to be faced with in the next 20 years.
- Please note, there will be NO Wastewater Challenge at the Raleigh conference
  as was originally planned. Although a success at the Sacramento conference,
  WEF felt there were significant flaws and insufficiencies that were not part of a
  major WEF event. For the Raleigh conference, there were Work plans that were
  not in the hands and reviewed by the Technical Advisory Committee prior to
  making a go-forward decision for Raleigh. This is a "one-time issue" and Bob
  Wimmer and his committee are actively pushing for Nashville conference.
- 4. Review of Proposed Conference Sites and Selection Process Greg Woodward
  - The Phoenix location originally planned for 2013 was "officially" dropped due to immigration law conflicts and lack of Phoenix leadership.
  - Nashville, TN has been selected by WEF and will be co-located with Energy Conference. The dates are May 5-8, 2013 and is awaiting final contract with the hotel. It is intended that there will be shared exhibit space and the Wastewater Challenge. A recommendation from the Tennessee MA was to include Doug Yaroz from Brown & Caldwell in the planning of the conference. There was discussion about having a member of the RBC be involved in the conference planning specifics. As no one at the meeting (later John Willis noted his knowledge of Doug) knew who Doug is and the knowledge of the conference issues that have been dealt with over the past many years. Discussion was held about having a co-chair for the conference working with Doug if that is his intent. Mike Moore will contact Bob O'Dette (TN Regulator) to see if he would have interest as well.
  - Do to the shifting of the conference from Phoenix to Nashville there was a
    potential of having two conferences (Nashville and Louisville, KY) in two
    consecutive years. Our general approach is to move the conferences around the
    country to allow different groups of individuals local to that site attend the
    conference. Shown below is the current anticipated rotation and group of sites /
    MA's who have expressed an interest in hosting future RBC Conferences.

- Speaker Honorarium There was discussion regarding the amount of money WEF budgets for speakers at the conferences.
