■ In early April, the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFUC) celebrated the completion of a \$278 million project to improve the seismic and operational reliability of the Harry Tracy Water Treatment Plant located in San Bruno, Calif. The largest part of the construction was a new 42 million L (11 million gal) treated water reservoir. During design, the discovery of the Serra Fault directly beneath crucial portions of the facility prompted a significant redesign of the project to relocate and completely rebuild the treated water reservoir in its current location.
