■ The 6.9-km (4.3-mi) Lee Tunnel, managed by Thames Water, is the largest project ever undertaken by the United Kingdom's privatized water industry. The tunnel redirects more than 16 million tonne of wastewater and stormwater away from discharge into the River Lee annually. The tunnel, located 80 m (262 ft) beneath the streets of London, this year received the Greatest Contribution to London Award for the second time. Thames Water
