The Legislative Solution

- Establish a distinction between the reporting requirements of unauthorized discharges and spills.
- Create a reporting threshold of nonenvironmentally threatening accidental spills. Those less than 1000 gallons will be summarized on a monthly basis and sent only to the TCEQ.

- Educate lawmakers on the issue
- Submit alternative bill language to lawmakers
- Correctly identify the problem
- Develop white papers and position statements on domestic septage land application and addition of grit and grease



Grit and Grease Bills

SB 746/HB 2517: Would prohibit the permitting of Class B sludge with the addition of grit and grease waste. **RECEIVED COMMITTEE HEARING** by Sen Kolkhorst(R) and Rep Stephenson(R)

HB 2092: Would prohibit the land app permitting of Class B sludge with the addition of grit and grease trap waste *including* processed G&G trap waste. by Geanie Morrison(D) **RECEIVED COMMITTEE HEARING, PASSED COMMITTEE, BUT DID NOT PASS OUT OF HOUSE FLOOR.**

Anti Biosolids Bill

HB 1250: Bracketed bill that would allow Country Commissioners to prohibit land application of ALL classes of biosolids in the county. DID NOT RECEIVE COMMITTEE HEARING



Domestic Septage Bills

HB 3642/SB 1724: Relating to a permit requirement for the land application of domestic septage. by Rep Burns(R) and Sen Birdwell(R) DID NOT RECEIVE COMMITTEE HEARING

HB 3644/SB 1723: Relating to collection of soil monitoring samples from land application units where sewage sludge or domestic septage is applied.

by Rep Burns(R) and Sen Birdwell(R) **DID NOT RECEIVE COMMITTEE HEARING**

Conclusions for Continued Success on Biosolids Front

- Need for continued education of lawmakers and public
- Distinction between Domestic Septage and Biosolids
- Local control of biosolids land application
- Benefits of biosolis and resource recovery
- Dispelling myths/improving public perception and public trust

Conclusions for Continued Success

- Be strategic and have a plan
- Playing offense and defense aren't as dissimilar as one would think - sometimes defense looks a lot like offense
- Engage Stakeholders
- Work closely with regulators
